ALVIN ALCORN is a rare American individual whose participation in Jazz spans its beginnings, its revival and its present continuity. He was born in 1912 into a musical family and while still in his early teens had played with A.J.Piron, Henry Allen Snr., and The Excelsior Brass Band.

In 1951 Alvin joined the famous Papa Celestin Band and later spent 4 years with Kid Ory, during which period attention was drawn to his playing to a wider audience through the film 'The Benny Goodman Story'.

Younger audiences will have heard Alvin's playing through Paul Simon's 'Take Me To The Mardi Gras'. Since his time with the George Lewis Band, Alvin has concentrated on solo guest work throughout the USA and is in such demand for live and recording work that the opportunity to travel abroad rarely can be taken. 'NEW ORLEANS AND THE BLUES' IS a rare occasion.

TOMMY TUCKER to appear in UK tour 'NEW ORLEANS AND THE BLUES' with CHRIS BARBER'S JAZZ & BLUES BAND and ALVIN ALCORN

Tommy Tucker, born in Springfield, Ohio, started his career with local Rhythm & Blues groups in the early fifties. He then became a member of the resident band at the Farm Dell Club in Dayton, backing such artistes as Roosevelt Sykes, Billie Holiday and Jimmy Reed. By the mid-fifties TOMMY TUCKER was writing and recording his own songs as well as playing piano with Roland Kirk.

Then came 'Hi-Heel Sneakers' - a song written and recorded by Tommy which established him, somewhat reluctantly, as a 'pop' artiste. The song has been recorded by 137 artistes at the last count and some of the more notable versions were by Cleo Laine, Sammy Davis Jnr., Roland Kirk, Tom Jones, Stevie Wonder - to name just a few! More recently, Tommy has toured with The American Blues Legends during which time he first met drummer Pete York who is now with the Chris Barber Band.

TOMMY TUCKER renews his acquaintance with Pete when he appears with CHRIS BARBER'S JAZZ & BLUES BAND and New Orleans trumpeter ALVIN ALCORN for the 'NEW ORLEANS & THE BLUES' tour.

## CHRIS BARBER TRAVELLIN' ON

Thirty years ago a certain Harry Brown sold to an 18 year old insurance actuary a second hand trombone for the princely sum of six pounds ten shillings. This somewhat dubious transaction ( "It was an an awful trombone" recalls Chris) was the first step to a new career as a professional jazz musician and band leader for Chris Barber. Soon after forming his first amateur band in 1949 he threw up for good his job as an actuary ( the man who calculates the odds for insurance companies) to become a full-time musician and then in 1954 formed his present band. Since then Chris has travelled distances equal to two trips to the moon, and back, in taking his music around the world. Still travelling, the Band makes its first ever concert tour of Australia this autumn. Before that they embark on a UK tour with American guests TOMMY TUCKER and ALVIN ALCORN in a special concert presentation entitled 'NEW ORLEANS AND THE BLUES'.
